



Trip Checklist

Planning ahead for your petsitter.

The following list is a checklist for you to print and verify before you leave on your trip. It insures you that all the necessary details have been addressed to make your time away from your pet(s) worry free. Please call if you have any questions: Nalas Pet Sitters 702-349-9214

- Make sure that all locks/keys are functional.
- Notify us if any gates or alarm codes have changed.
- Notify us if any other person(s) will be in or on property, this would include pool men, gardeners (as they might leave gates open and we will check them on the days that they have been there), house keepers, relatives/friends.
- Walk around your yard and make sure there is no way a dog can dig under, jump over or otherwise run off while you are away.
- Notify us if your veterinarian has changed or moved.
- Provide enough food, litter, medicines and any other items that your pet/house might need while you are away. Plus, a little extra in case you are delayed.
- Provide contact numbers and or email addresses in case we need to reach you.
- In the case of sick or elderly pets, it is always a good idea to provide your wishes in writing and dated in case they should need medical attention or euthanization while you are away.
- Leave mail box key on the counter with the number if you would like your mail brought in while you are away.
- Notify us if you have any additions to your home that need caring for (even a plant), and don't forget the little ones, hermit crabs, fish, mice etc...
- Please notify us if your departure/return dates/times have changed.
- Let us know where leashes and cat carriers are kept. Also, if your pet does not do well in the car, let us know.
- Let us know of any new behavior patterns/problems, this way we will know what to expect and how to handle each situation.
- If you're animal is an outdoor pet. Please remember that our climate in the desert is very extreme! Temperatures can range from freezing to 122 degrees. They do need shelter and plenty of fresh clean water. Bedding to keep warm, toys to play with, and kiddie pools, can make their life outdoors more comfortable. Remember, they are mammals like you and I, and can get sunburned, suffer from heat stroke, paw burns, and dehydration. Please consider all of your options before deciding to leave them out doors.
